



National & Local Updates

Outdoor Activities – In England up to six people can meet under social distancing rules in a private garden. Going indoors is limited only to using the loo or in order to access a garden.

Face Coverings – Face coverings will be compulsory on public transport from Monday 15th June and the general advice is to wear a face covering when in enclosed spaces where social distancing may not always be possible and where you may come into contact with strangers. It is recognised that a face covering is not the same as a PPE facemask used by healthcare workers.

Shopping — Non-essential shops are poised to open from Monday 15th June. Some large chains such as John Lewis are phasing their reopening so our advice is to check individual websites for full details.

Household Recycling Centres — Wiltshire Council have introduced a booking system for visits to all Wiltshire HRCs. Bookings must be made via the Wiltshire Council website and in order to do this you must also have registered on the Wiltshire Council website.

Social Bubbles – The Prime Minister issued guidelines to support single people to ensure they may have closer contact with family and friends – I have tried to distill this down to a few words but failed miserably! For full details please go to gov.uk to appraise yourself fully of these requirements and if you fulfill the eligibility requirements.

Pubs and Restaurants – This still looks like early July before any form of opening so please keep supporting the Somerset Arms in any way you can.

Corona Virus Testing - The Government have been stressing the importance of getting tested for the virus if you are presenting any of the symptoms of Corona Virus, including a persistent cough, high temperature, or a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste. These tests are now available to anyone and not just front line or key workers. You can apply for the test via the government website and they are available as either an at home test kit or via one of the drive through centres. The nearest drive through centres are either Swindon or Bristol Airport. If in doubt get vourself tested.

Zoos – Zoos can reopen from Monday 15th June and this includes Longleat.

What Next For Semington?

As we edge ever closer to a return to a semblance of normality, the Parish Council and the Support Group Core Team have been working closely to understand how we build on the even greater sense of community that Semington has developed during the Corona Virus pandemic. Over the next few weeks we will be asking for villagers to share with us the things that matter to them and what they would like to see happen in the place we all call home.
